I am writing to respond to your request [REDACTED] [REDACTED] March 2016. Oxford University Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust can confirm that it holds the data that you requested.

Whilst we have records of LINEAR ACCELERATORS in the OUHFT, the level of detail does not extend to being able to identify that they are capable of delivering 'TARGETed Intraoperative Radiotherapy'. The devices in use, and presumably the only devices currently in the OUH, are the QTY: x6 **CLINAC 2100EX** managed under the MES in the CHURCHILL CANCER CENTRE. These were installed in APRIL 2008.

We have details of, now disposed, Qty: x6 LINEAR ACCELERATORS with installation dates back to 1992 that were still in operation until 2009 / 2010. These are ELEKTA and VARIAN systems. Likewise, the details available do not describe their capabilities.

The S&O Division have not purchased equipment for the use of intraoperative radiotherapy. The Trust does not provide intraoperative RT, therefore does not participate in Targit trials.

Please note that on 1 November 2011 the Oxford Radcliffe Hospitals NHS Trust (ORH) merged with the Nuffield Orthopaedic Hospital NHS Trust (NOC) to form the Oxford University Hospitals NHS Trust (OUH). Our response reflects these changes. Therefore, we consider that Oxford University Hospitals Trust has released to you all of the information that it holds in relation to your request.
