

The first people you meet will probably be our Paediatric Oncology Outreach Nurse Specialists (POONS).

They will come to your house and tell you who to contact if you are worried or have questions. They can also contact your school to explain what is happening.

You will be given **open access** to the Children's Ward at the Horton General Hospital. This means that if you become unwell, or have a temperature of 38 degrees C or over, you should call the Ward.

After calling you must go to the Ward immediately: please bring all your medicines with you.

If your parents are very worried about you, they should call an ambulance to take you to the Horton General Hospital **Emergency Department**.

While you are in hospital

While you are in hospital our on-call paediatric team will look after you. The Horton General Hospital and the John Radcliffe Hospital are both part of Oxford University Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust, so we will contact Kamran's Ward when we admit you, and they will be able to see all your electronic records, including blood results and X-rays.

We can look after you when you are unwell, give you blood and platelet transfusions if needed, and treatment if you have contact with chickenpox, but you will have your chemotherapy at the John Radcliffe Hospital.

You will have your own room, and one parent or carer can stay with you overnight on a sofa bed. We will clean your room every day.

If you are neutropenic you will not be able to use the playroom, but our play therapists can bring fun things into your room for you to do.

We can give you a snack between mealtimes if you like.

Visiting

Your parents, grandparents and siblings can visit at any time, but friends and other family members should come between 11.00am and 8.00pm.
