

# **Gynaecology Ward – Women's Centre**

The Gynaecology Ward provides 20 inpatient beds, a Day Case Unit and a Triage Service. We deliver medical and surgical care for a wide range of gynaecological conditions including, but not limited to:

- urogynaecology
- endometriosis
- heavy PV bleeding
- chronic pelvic pain
- complications in early pregnancy (up to 16 weeks gestation).

The Triage Service receives referrals from Community Midwives, GPs, A&E and other areas of the hospitals. These are urgent referrals and can include patients with heavy bleeding, ovarian torsions, severe pain, ectopic pregnancies and urinary retention due to prolapse.
