


# **Health for Me**

Secure access to your hospital health record



A FREE ONLINE SITE that allows you to view parts of your health record

### What is Health for Me?

**Health for Me** is a free online system that allows you to view parts of your hospital health record securely on your computer or smartphone.

Access is being offered to patients receiving care at Oxford University Hospitals by selected services.

If you are an eligible patient aged 16 or over, we will offer you access to **Health for Me** when you attend your appointment.

#### If you choose to have access, we will ask you:

- a few questions to confirm your identity
- to answer a security question (you will need to remember this)
- for your email address, so we can send you an invitation.

When you receive your invitation email, we will ask you to confirm your identity and answer your security question. You will then be able to create a secure login for **Health for Me**.

Once you are registered, you will be directed to the **Health for Me** web page which can also be found by scanning this QR code:



OUH patients who have been registered with **Health for Me** can also access their health records on their iPhone via the Apple Health App.

### What can I do on Health for Me?

- View your results
  - Blood results
  - Scan results (diagnostic non-lab)
  - Biopsy results (cellular pathology)
- View the date, time and location of your next appointment
- Download clinical letters from the hospital (we will send paper copies also unless you opt out of this)
- Receive and respond to messages about your care
- Complete health questionnaires online
- View your recorded allergies and procedures
- Access useful links about your care

N.B. Though your appointments and clinical letters can be viewed here, your appointment letters are viewed through a separate website, drdoctor.co.uk.

# Who can access my information

Only you will have access to your information. **Health for Me** is protected by similar security that used with internet banking. You will have your own login details and security questions.

# Is my GP record included?

At the moment you can only see information held on our hospital system. Your GP record is on a different system, but we hope to include this in the future. Similarly, results and information held by other hospitals will not be available in **Health for Me** unless they have been added to the OUH record.
