Information about your placement

EAU is a fast-paced emergency medicine unit with a wide variety of patients. We currently have 24 medical beds and our aim is to have a length of stay of 12-18 hours. Our main patient group is medical direct GP referrals, usually in the region of 60 patients per day. A lot of these patients can be acutely unwell and need fast assessment and treatment.

We have an assessment area and an ambulatory area where all our GP referrals are assessed. We also receive admissions from the Emergency Department that require a length of stay of more than four hours. These can include patients awaiting the Frailty Intervention Team, specialty input or mental health services.

- Patient admission, assessment and care planning
- Providing person-centred care with dignity
- Key nursing skills physiological observations, ECG recording
- Enhanced assessment skills
- Recognising and responding to the deteriorating patient
- Identifying and management of Frail Elderly patients in Ambulatory Setting

- Complex discharge planning (including nursing home placement, community hospital referral, liaising about packages of care for patients)
- Key communication skills between patients, carers, other professionals; recognising barriers to communication and adapting your approach accordingly.
- Electronic care planning and documentation

- Sepsis management
