Horton Theatres has four theatres and five recovery beds in the Day Surgery Unit. We see a wide variety of specialties and our patient population comprises both adults and children.

Theatres are staffed by operating department practitioners (ODP), nurses, nursing associates and healthcare support workers. The department also has porters and housekeeping support. The medical staff are mainly anaesthetists and surgeons.
