Location

Cotswold Birth Centre, Russell Way, Chipping Norton, Oxon OX7 5FA

Once you turn down Russell Way, follow the road round to the left and you will come to a car park – parking is free of charge. There is a building within the car park and we are located on the top floor (accessible by lift or stairs).

Key learning opportunities

- Provision of routine antenatal and postnatal care
- Identifying complexities in pregnancy and liaising with the multidisciplinary team
- Breastfeeding support, including for those experiencing more complex difficulties
- Provision of intrapartum care in a community setting, including home birth
- Running a Glucose Tolerance Test Clinic

- Newborn Hearing Screening clinic runs every Friday afternoon at the Cotswold Birth Centre

Typical shift patterns

The majority of shifts are either 8am-4pm or 9am-5pm. Occasionally we may work a later shift from 12pm-8pm. Students will also be allocated overnight on-call shifts alongside their supervisor.
